

Dr. Guenevere Burke is an assistant professor of emergency medicine at the George Washington University (GW). In this role, she is actively involved in clinical care, medical education and interdisciplinary programs in health policy, health equity and healthcare technology.

Dr. Burke leads the Atlantic Fellows for Health Equity at the GW Health Workforce Institute and holds a secondary faculty appointment in the School of Public Health. She is co-director of the Health Policy Scholarly Concentration and the Residency Fellowship in Health Policy at the School of Medicine and Health Sciences. In collaboration with Kaiser Permanente, Dr. Burke pioneered new residency programs in health policy for the Northern and Southern California regions.

Dr. Burke is a board-certified emergency physician who provides patient care at George Washington University Hospital and Walter Reed National Military Medical Center. She is also involved in local telemedicine programs for emergency care and expanded access to specialty care for underserved patients. She is immediate past president of the District of Columbia American College of Emergency Physicians, and a Fellow of the American College of Emergency Physicians

Dr. Burke completed fellowship training in health policy at GW, working with the Kaiser Family Foundation and serving as health policy advisor to Senator Grassley, a member of the Senate Finance Committee. She completed her medical education at UCLA and residency training at the University of Southern California, where she served as chief resident. She holds an MBA from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and previously worked in international healthcare consulting and hospital finance prior to her career in medicine.
